# **Opportunity Zone Funds**

On August 1st, the DDC hosted a visit for Justin Rostoff, an attorney with the law firm of Klein Slowik, PLLC in New York City. Justin, having ties to Peoria, is interested in growth opportunities in the downtown and is working with developers to provide and channel Opportunity Zone Funds to new projects in Peoria's revitalization efforts. During his visit, Justin met with several DDC board members, local developers, and city officials to learn about all aspects of development, including challenges, such as parking, as well as opportunities and available incentives. He gave a presentation to the DDC board on how Opportunity Zone Funds can provide financial assistance to developers to help them with redevelopment.

Bob joined OSF HealthCare in 1981 as a Medical Technologist in the Laboratory at OSF Saint Francis. Bob held various positions in the laboratory, becoming Director of Laboratory Services in 1987 and Corporate Director of Laboratories for OSF HealthCare in 1998. In 2005, Bob moved to Administration as the Vice President of Technical and Support services. Bob became Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer at OSF HealthCare Saint Francis Medical Center in 2011 and accepted the role of President of the medical center in November 2017.

A graduate of Eureka College, Bob obtained his master's degree in Health Services Administration from the College of Saint Francis in Joliet, Illinois, in 1995. In 2012, he earned his Fellow credential in the American College of Healthcare Executives.

A lifelong Central Illinois resident, Bob was named to 40 Leaders Under 40 in Peoria, and he has served on the boards of a number of Peoria non-profit organizations including Family House, Heart of Illinois United Way, Peoria Hospitals Mobile Medical Services, and Central Illinois American Red Cross.

When asked about his involvement with the DDC, Bob had this to say: "The DDC has been instrumental in so many positive things going on in the downtown that it is hard to choose just one, but if I had to it would be the increase in housing opportunities downtown. The DDC supports this important work in many ways, from working with developers to ensure they are aware of the financial supports for this redevelopment work, to partnering with the City to ensure that parking is available to support both housing and retail needs. The energy and vitality in the Warehouse District is exciting, and I am proud to serve on the board of the corporation that supports this work!"

Bob said that his vision is for downtown Peoria to become a hub of residential, commercial and entertainment venues that attract people from within our community and beyond to experience all the special things Peoria has to offer. "As one of the area's largest employers, our leadership team at OSF HealthCare is excited about our move to Downtown, where we can take advantage of all that is offered. We are happy to provide an influx of several hundred new workers to the Downtown, knowing this will spur continued growth and development. So much is happening right now that is taking us in the right direction—new commercial businesses, growth in great places to eat, families living downtown, the riverfront with its walkways and park as well as the museum and entertainment venues—all combine to make it an exciting time to be in Peoria!"

Per the DDC bylaws, in making appointments to the Board, consideration is given to the needs of the Corporation, the potential appointee's experience, background and interest in the Corporation and economic development matters, and the benefits to the Corporation to be derived from the service of the appointee. No person who has a sustained conflict of interest between his own responsibilities and interest and those of the Corporation (e.g. being a developer in the downtown or rental property owner) shall be appointed to or remain on the Board of Directors. In addition to other appropriate qualifications, all persons appointed to the Board of Directors shall possess high civic ideals and shall vigorously represent the entity or district from which they have been selected. 


